Though Gulfsha is 14 years old, she is studying in the 5th standard in the HOPE school. She has three sisters and two brothers. She was not academically brilliant, but attending the HOPE school has really helped her. Her studies were not helped by her father, Laeek Ahmed, returning to his hometown after his father died.



Though he moved to take care of his family, he found that he was unable to support them there. He moved back to Delhi and started working a daily wage labourer, but he was unable to admit his children to a government school again. Gulfsha's aunt told them about the HOPE school so her father enrolled her and her brother, Sohail. Both she and her brother enjoy attending the classes in the school. They now enjoy studying and want to study further. Gulfsha wants to become a teacher and her brother wants to become a doctor. They are both grateful as they have a way of fulfilling their dreams through the HOPE school.
