Learning In Spite Of Difficulties

Javed is a sweet 7-year-old boy. His family moved from Uttar Pradesh to Delhi looking for better job opportunities 17 years ago. But their story took a tragic turn as his father suddenly died from a heart attack at the age of 35, leaving his wife to raise 4 children. With no source of income, the family was forced to depend on Javed's uncle for money. His uncle can barely support his family and has very little to spare for his brother's family.

In addition to all their problems, Javed has a learning disability. No other school in the locality was willing to take him in and it was only in the HOPE *worldwide* school that he started learning how to read and write. Javed has been attending the school in Tigri for one and a half years, and he is now in kindergarten. Since Javed joined the HOPE *worldwide* school, his family has seen him improve a great deal in reading and writing.

Javed's favorite memory is when he was part of a dance routine in the school. He also enjoys his drawing classes and he would like to be a police officer when he grows up. Through the financial support that the family receives for Javed's education, his mother hopes that Javed will have better opportunities than she alone is able to provide for him. A Better Life for Kausar

Kausar and his family live just a few minutes away from the HOPE *worldwide* school. Naushad's parents migrated to Delhi 20 years ago in the hopes of finding better job opportunities. His mother Shahzadi walks him and his two other siblings to the school every morning, while his father Naushad leaves for the day to sell fruit in the neighborhood. In a good month, his father only makes INR 3000-4000 (USD 61- 82).

Kausar's mother sends Kausar and his two younger siblings to the HOPE *worldwide* school because she believes her children deserve a better life than what she can offer them. She believes that with the help of the teachers, Kausar will become the doctor he wishes to be, so that he can in turn help others in need. Kausar is now 8 years old and studying in the 1st standard. Personally he loves the school because of the attention he receives from the teachers.

One of Kausar's worst memories is watching his father working very hard to support the family. He hopes that by getting an education, he will be able to help his father support the family. Some of his good memories are going on school picnics and playing board games in his free time.
